How is the succession to the throne regulated?

The succession to the throne is regulated not only through descent, but also by Parliamentary statute. The order of succession is the sequence of members of the Royal Family in the order in which they stand in line to the throne.

Can a spouse of a royal family become a throne heir?

Spouses of the monarch's relatives are not eligible for succession to the throne, although the spouses of his relatives in the first and second degrees of consanguinity are members of the Royal House. Degrees of consanguinity are measured by the distance from a common ancestor or descendant, either in the direct or collateral line.

Can a Protestant heir be a heir to the throne?

The Act of Settlement 1701 provides that Protestant "heirs of the body" (that is, legitimate descendants) of Sophia, Electress of Hanover, are eligible to succeed to the throne, unless otherwise disqualified.

What does the succession to the Crown Act do?

The Succession to the Crown Act (2013) amended the provisions of the Bill of Rights and the Act of Settlement to end the system of male primogeniture, under which a younger son can displace an elder daughter in the line of succession. The Act applies to those born after 28 October 2011.
